out of necessity but with no idea of how to pay for it; Ilse and Gerald Nelson who decided together that Triform would be a good home for Gerald, where he guided many Triformers into community-life through his music appreciation evenings and love of baseball; the gardeners who decided where to place the garden, carefully laid out the beds, and built a tall fence to keep the deer at bay; and Kevin Keane, Dusty Rhodes, and their families and the many other supporters who saw the potential of acquiring the Stewardship property and the benefit of connecting the two sites with the tunnel.

One could say that much of what composes the physical "body" of Triform, including our landscape, barns, buildings, and homes, is like great trees, grown out of the wood of commitment and intention. Grown so that the most vulnerable may find shade-shade from the intensity of the midday sun and from the stern gaze of a society fixed on ascribing an individual's value according to their output. If the last one and a half years have taught us anything, it is that "worth" is truly in the eye of the beholder and our own experience is the only actual reality. For over 40 years, many who have known and loved Triform have worked from this knowledge to create deep roots that will bear future fruit.

On the 16th of June 2021, with the passing of Dev Barker, Triform said farewell to one of our great friends and the father of Triform Journeyperson Holly Barker. Serving as our board chairman since 2015, Dev was an incredibly strong support, particularly during the last months of the pandemic. His calm confidence in the community's ability to safeguard itself and support everyone who is a part of Triform was essential to our own sense of being able to withstand these difficult times. Dev was always there when Triform needed him, quietly waiting for the moment to ask just the right question. On the lawn below Christofferus House a Linden tree has been planted in Dev's memory, which will cast shade from its strong branches for centuries to come. The simple act of planting a tree requires hope, hope and trust that future generations will protect and nurture that which has been planted. Dev Barker personified this hope in the timelessness of Triform's mission, planting seeds for future years of strength and purpose. We miss him.





We can look with both love and sadness on that which was and at the same time turn our chins firmly into the wind, roll up our sleeves, and prepare with love and dedication for that which is yet to come. 






Letter from a Triform Parent

Ryan Huntington's Journey to Triform

Ryan Huntington's life started with dark clouds and rain; it started with the diagnosis of autism. As Ryan approached two years old, he still had no language. His mom worked with him endlessly with no success. Then, one evening, as we ate dinner, we looked up and Ryan was pressing the fingertips of both hands together. He was making the sign for "more." He wanted more cereal. When we saw Ryan signing, it was like the most brilliant rainbow had emerged from those dark clouds. We cried.

Sarah would try to see the world as Ryan saw it, wondering what she was missing. She, and we, finally found a dependable bridge into Ryan's world through music. Ryan has always had a song in his heart. When he is feeling his song most, there's a hop in his step.

Ryan's affinity for music has played a big role in his life. At age three, he was exposed to a pianist. He listened intently and then walked to the piano and played the melody of Beethoven's "Ode to Joy". His fingers danced on the keys without any guidance or piano lessons. Triform has strengthened his heart songs. He is happy to share his recommended music list in the Triform newsletter and he is happy singing to the cows.

Subsequently, Ryan's mom persisted in her efforts, pairing spoken word with signs, and Ryan learned to speak. As he approached two years old with no speech, who would have imagined 16 years later Ryan would become the lead vocalist for a band, playing at a resort hotel in the Sinai Desert of Egypt singing songs in *Arabic*!

People with autism see the world differently. When little, his sister Sarah noted Ryan focused on edges, spinning objects, and details other people would miss. For example, he was mesmerized by



Ryan prefers a set routine without changes, as do many people with autism. It did not help that, while growing up, Ryan and his family moved more than a dozen times. Ryan's rainbow emerged in Kansas City, Missouri, but passed through New England; Cairo, Egypt (where Ryan's mom helped start a school for handicapped children); Jerusalem; Tennessee; and Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam. Then, upon returning to the USA after three years in Vietnam, Ryan and his family took a boat ride to Fisher's Island, New York. It is then that Ryan's rainbow began arching down to Triform.

Ryan's uncle Rick worked on the Fisher's Island Ferry. Uncle Rick and his wife, Kathleen, took us to the annual Arts and Crafts Fair on the island. At the fair, we met Bill Furse. Bill had formerly attended Triform and was an strong advocate of its virtues. Bill, Rick, and Kathleen encouraged us to investigate Triform for Ryan.

We visited Triform and found a treasure at the end of a rainbow. It was the best environment we could imagine for Ryan. The farm setting was wonderful. And, the people of the Triform community not only cared, but celebrated the individuals living there- seeing their strengths and nurturing social and emotional growth. Triform was a safe, inclusive community, where every community member upheld friendship, harmony, and grace.

As Ryan entered Triform, we felt we could no longer provide the energy and home life best for his continued growth. Triform has brought healing to our whole family. And, Triform has allowed Ryan to continue to mature and grow in independence. Ryan loves the friends he has made at Triform, and Triform has expanded Ryan's interests. He has also gained the ability to self-advocate and to advocate for others at Triform. Ryan has become a social justice warrior. At his apprenticeship ceremony,

one of Ryan's mentors described Ryan as a "Knight in Shining Armor," a young man who fights against injustice and stands up to support those who are struggling and less able. Noticing and highlighting Ryan's kindness made us very proud.

While going through life with kindness and caring, Ryan continues to shine. He brings light and rainbows into the world, and we learn so much from him. There is no way Ryan would have made the strides he has made without the amazing co-workers (angels) from around the world, householders, and the entire Triform Community. Ryan continues to be one of the most empathetic and nicest human beings we know. May his rainbow keep shining through dark clouds, rain, sunshine, and happy days.
